Techniques of “UKIYOE” Woodblock Printing and Visit to Edo-Tokyo Museum

Printing “UKIYOE”, Japanese traditional art of woodblock print, needs multiple colors and requires highly-developed skills. To make one complete Ukiyoe, the artisan prints the same design in different colors more than 10 times. During the course, we will have a close look on the techniques and “Ukiyoe” making process, from carving to printing. Then we will visit Edo-Tokyo Museum, where you can see more “Ukiyoe”, models of the cities and buildings and artifacts of Edo-period.
